Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Christian Virtues are celebrated and emphasized throughout our school community through monthly virtue assemblies, where virtuous behaviours are prayed for and celebrated by staff, students and parents. All students receive a "virtue bracelet" by the end of the school year.

Virtues are emphasized and taught throughout the curriculum, as well as reflected/reviewed in discipline and conflict resolution when addressing behaviours at school.
